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PROCEEDING OF THE DISTRICT LEVEL PROCUREMENT COMMITTEE MEETING FOR THE KMS-2018-19 HELD ON 10.10.2018 IN THE SADBHAVANA SAHBAGRUHA OF COLLECTORATE , KALAHANDI.

The District Level Procurement Committee (DLPC) meeting on procurement of paddy for the KMS 2018-19 (Kharif) was held on 10.10.2018 at 3.00 PM in the Sadbhavana Sabhagruha of the Collectorate, Kalahandi. The meeting commenced being presided by the Collector and Dist. Magistrate, Kalahandi as Chairman.

Hon'ble M.L.A, Junagarh and the representatives of other Public Representatives attended the meeting. PD, DRDA, Sub-Collector, Bhawanipatna, Sub-Collector, Dharmagarh, Deputy Director (Agriculture), CSO, DRCS, Miller's representatives and Farmers' representatives and other members of DLPC were present and took part in discussion. The list of participants enclosed herewith in Annexure-I.

At the outset, the CSO, Kalahandi welcomed the Chairperson, the Public Representatives and all other participants in the meeting and requested the Chair to permit to proceed the meeting as per the agenda. The Collector, Kalahandi welcoming all participants in the meeting, requested the CSO, to brief out the Food and Procurement Policy and to carry on the meeting as per the agenda.

1. TARGET & ACHIEVMENT FOR THE KMS:2017-18:

Regarding target and achievement of the last KMS-2017-18 (both Kharif and Rabi), the CSO stated that Q.46.21.866.00 of paddy was purchased from 53283 farmers in Kharif and 13119 farmers in Rabi. 74 PACS through 149 PPC purchased paddy and delivered to 77 millers of this district. TDCC was entrusted the work of paddy procurement, but did not participate.

The entire Custom Milled Rice (CMR) Q.31,37,735.00 was due against the Millers for the said paddy which has been completely delivered by the millers to Govt. at Rice Receiving Centers (RRC) of OSCSC Ltd and FCI.

2. MINIMUM SUPPORT PRICE (MSP) OF PADDY :

The Civil Supplies Officer, Kalahandi informed to the house about Minimum Support Price (MSP) of paddy for the KMS 2018-19 declared by the Govt of India communicated by Food Supplies & Consumer Welfare Department in the Food and Procurement Policy as follows.

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| a. Common (FAQ) paddy | Rs. 1750/- per Quintal |
| b. Grade "A" (FAQ) paddy | Rs. 1770/- per quintal |

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3. FIXATION OF NORMS OF SURPLUS PADDY PER ACRE:

The CSO, Kalahandi stated in the meeting that during the last KMS 2017-18 (Khariff Crop) Q. 18.00 and Q. 12.00 per acre of irrigated and non-irrigated land respectively was fixed as per acre yield. For the ensuing KMS: 2018-19 the per acre yield is awaited from Govt.. In this context explaining the norms for fixing per acre yield the CSO, Kalahandi stated that per acre marketable surplus paddy is decided by the State Government taking into consideration of the statistics on paddy production of different areas across the State and the same is reflected in P-PAS as surplus of each farmer.

The CSO, Kalahandi also apprised the house that in the last year the saleable paddy of a farmer was arrived by deducting 3.00 qntl. of paddy per head of each member of his family. But this year, the Govt. has pleased to eliminate such provision and the farmer is eligible to sale all his yield and get MSP.

4) FARMERS REGISTRATION:

The CSO, Kalahandi stated that the system of Farmers Registration in the district is continuing as the procedure adopted last season where the digitization of farmer's data was made after verification of farmer details by the Revenue Inspector (RI) and Village Agricultural Worker (VAW) regarding the land particulars and the authenticity of actual cultivation respectively.

As in this season, the Govt. is putting utmost pressure for inclusion of all actual cultivators, specifically the sharecroppers, small and marginal farmers into the procurement fold so that no farmer will be deprived of getting MSP and face distress sale. In this context, a meeting was arranged under the Chairmanship of the Collector, Kalahandi where all the Chief Executives of Paddy Procuring PACS/ LAMPCS and all District level and Sub-Divisional officials involved in Paddy Procurement including DDA, Kalahandi and his subordinate officers on 23.08.2018. In this meeting, as directed by the Collector, Kalahandi, all the VAWs deployed in G.Ps. have been engaged for inclusion of all left out cultivators through new registration. For this purpose, the PACS have supplied 40,000 nos. of New Registration Forms along with the list of required documents to the VAWs of their area of operation who are in contact with such Farmers for enrollment in the procurement process and also submitting the filled up Registration Forms along with all required documents for registration in the PACS. The process is continuing and till now about 9000 nos. of new farmers have been enrolled .

In this course of discussion, Sri Dipti Praharaj, Farmers Representative expressed that a good number of farmers have diverted their crop from paddy cultivation to other crop like Cotton, Maize/ Arhar/ etc., and hence, precaution need to be taken so that no such farmers who are cultivating other crops are included in paddy procurement process, as it will encourage fake transaction. On this, the DDA, Kalahandi stated that he has issued direction to all his VAWs in this regard.

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5) OPENING OF PADDY PROCURING CENTRE (PPC) BY THE PACS:

The CSO, Kalahandi informed the House that the DRCS, Kalahandi has submitted list for opening 166 nos. of PPCs to be operated for paddy procurement as proposed by 74 nos. of PACS for this KMS:2018-19 (Khariff Crop). In this context, Hon'ble MLA, Junagarh expressed that the PPCs should be operated keeping in view of convenience of the farmer and there should not be any ambiguity in delineation of the area of each PPC. On this, the CSO, Kalahandi stated that the selection of PPCs to be decided in this house of DLPC Meeting. Deliberating in the discussion, the Collector, Kalahandi asked the CSO to read out the list of PACS-wise PPCs submitted by the DRCS, Kalahandi so that all members can express their view for any modification.

Accordingly, the CSO, Kalahandi apprised the house about all the 172 proposed PPCs and detail discussion was made by all the participants and the following suggestions for inclusion of New PPCs were made.

Keeping in view of above proposals for modification, the DRCS, Kalahandi was asked to submit the modified list of PPCs for operation of paddy procurement.

Further, as regards the complaint petition received from the farmers of Ampani PACS for reorganization of PPC by tagging of villages, ARCS, Dharamgarh apprised the house that the matter has been resolved at the PACS level by conducting the farmers meeting.

6) IMPLEMENTATION OF PADDY PROCUREMENT AUTOMATION SYSTEM (P-PAS):

The C.S.O informed the house that all the 12 nos. of Paddy Procuring Blocks in Kalahandi District have been covered under P-PAS where all transactions of paddy procurement are being taken up through online and the MSP directly credited online to the bank accounts of the farmers within 24 hours to 72 hours. In this context, the Collector, Kalahandi insisted upon that the paddy transactions are to be updated both by the PACS as well as the Millers on the same day. Any delay in this regard will be dealt with serious action.

7) ROLE OF PACS:

The CSO explained the role of PACS as per the guidelines of Food & Procurement Policy, and the following matters were discussed.

i) **Issue of Token** : Narrating the role of PACS in procurement process, the CSO, Kalahandi stated that the system of issue of token to the farmers will remain the same as adopted in the last season, where the RI will select the farmer to whom the Token to be issued, and the Token will be issued with the joint signature of RI and the Purchase Officer. In this context, Hon'ble MLA, Junagarh put stress to give maximum opportunity to the small and

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marginal farmers to sell their paddy on priority basis. Some members wanted to know the classification of small and marginal farmers and the DDA, Kalahandi explained that a farmer holding land within one hectare is treated as marginal farmer and a farmer holding land one hectare to two hectares is the small farmer.

ii) Role of SoLPC: The CSO, Kalahandi stated that Society Level Procurement Committee (SoLPC) has overall responsibility to monitor and strengthen the procurement operation starting from issue of advance token to farmers, arrival of paddy at PPC, quality analysis of paddy at PPC, purchase and issue of vendor receipt and payment of MSP to farmers within the stipulated time. All the concerned BDOs have been requested to constitute the SoLPC for each PACS and notify before commencement of paddy procurement. The RI and the VAW as member of SoLPC will identify the small and marginal farmers, and it also can be observed from the marketable surplus reflected in P-PAS Portal for issuing advance token to the farmers.

The CSO, Kalahandi stated that the SoLPC will play the most important role in procurement process as it will remain in over all charges of paddy procurement operation at PACS. It will supervise the preparation of advance action plan; notify the list of farmers for selling paddy on each date at list 7 days in advance; monitor the actual procurement and transfer of paddy to the assigned custom millers after observing all formalities of SAS, MAS and P-PAS. It will also ensure payment of farmer dues within stipulated time.

Most importantly the SoLPC will remain vigilant on overall functioning of PPCs. They will ensure that the Marginal Farmers & Small Farmers are given priority to sell their paddy. In case of any dispute on quality analysis of paddy, the SoLPC need to resolve the issue

iii) Office of PPC: Some participants including Hon'ble MLA, Junagarh raised the problem faced by the farmers to attend the office of PACS in procurement related works as there are not enough facilities in the PPCs meant for them. The Collector, Kalahandi directed to perform all procurement related works in the PPC point so that the Farmers need not proceed to PACS for any such related works. In certain PPC where there are no facilities for maintaining office of PPC, the PACS will bear the cost of transportation of equipments from PACS to PPC point.

iv) Quality Analysis & Purchase of FAQ Paddy: The CSO stated that the MSP is meant for only FAQ paddy and so all PACS must ensure purchase of FAQ paddy. Hence, quality analysis of paddy is the most important factor of the procurement process. After proper analysis of paddy of each farmer, three sealed samples in cotton bags @250 gms has to be drawn. One such sample to be retained at PACS level for future reference and other two are to be given to the concerned farmer and the Miller. If any farmer / Miller is unsatisfied with the analysis at PPC level, then they can approach for re-analysis at RMC office concerned as 1st platform. If any farmer/Miller is still not satisfied with the analysis at 1st platform, then they can put forth their grievances at the 2nd platform in the office of concerned Sub-Collector for

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its re-analysis in presence of ARCS/ ACSO/ RMC Technical staff. In this context, all participants agreed that all paddy to be purchased only after quality analysis of the paddy.

Moreover, the Collector, Kalahandi clarified the house that VAWs will remain present in the concerned PPCs who will monitor the Analysis of paddy.

In this context, Sub-Collector, Bhawanipatna suggested for an extensive technical training need to be imparted to the Purchase Officers & other staffs of PACS, Millers' Agent, Farmers' Representatives, VAWs and RMC personnel. He also proposed that after the training all concerned equipments need to be tested.

v) Infrastructure at PPC: The CSO, Kalahandi stated that the PACS and the RMCs are to arrange all infrastructural facilities for the farmers in the PPCs like drinking water facility, Toilet facility, Temporary storage space for paddy, Rest Shed, Tarpaulin, Polythene sheets etc.. In this context, Sub-Collector, Dharmagarh stated that arrangements are being made to provide minimum sanitary facilities and sitting arrangement in the previously established PPCs having good cover sheds and basic infrastructure and temporary arrangements have been made in open PPCs.

Participating in the discussion, Sri Dipti Praharij, the Farmers Representative stated that mostly the PPCs are providing such facilities to the farmers and the system adopted in Kalahandi district for the procurement is the best in the State. However, he expressed his view to make a Model PPC in the district with all facilities so that it will be inspirational to others. In this context, the Hon'ble MLA, Junagarh proposed to renovate Banijara PPC under Junagarh Block as Model PPC, which has been unanimously selected to be the Model PPC of the district.

vi) Maintenance of Attendance Register: The PACS will maintain Attendance Registers of the Members of SoLPC, Farmers who bring their paddy for sale and Members of Purchase Team & Custom Millers or their representative on every purchases day. Only the above persons and officials/ procurement related persons will be allowed in the PPCs. No unwanted trespass should be allowed in to the PPCs and in case of any such incident the Purchases Officer will report to Nodal Officer and the nearest Police immediately.

8. ROLE OF FARMER:

Explaining the Role of Farmers in the PPCs, the CSO stated that no paddy shall be entertained at PACS/ PPC without obtaining Advance Token. If the paddy is brought by the farmers unauthorisedly without advance token, the Purchase Officers will report to the Nodal Officer and nearest Police immediately. Further the Farmers shall bring their FAQ Paddy from harvesting point to PACS/ PPCs at their own cost after obtaining Advance Token from the PACS/R.Is. If the paddy brought to PACS /PPC is found non-FAQ, the Farmer will be allowed to improve such paddy to attain FAQ norms at his cost. In no circumstances, the non-FAQ paddy will be entertained or purchased.

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9. ROLE OF MILLER:

Narrating the role of Miller, the CSO, Kalahandi stated that the Millers shall supply empty gunny bags well in advance to the assigned PACS/PPCs. In case of any Miller fails to supply gunny bags and use the farmers gunny bags for lifting of paddy, then the Miller has to pay the cost of gunny bag on the spot to concerned farmer. All Purchase Officers of PPCs need to maintain the distribution/ use of Gunny Bags in a separate register.

The CSO, Kalahandi approached the Millers to appoint their Representatives well in advance. In this context, the Hon'ble MLA, Junagarh expressed that in most of the PPCs, the Miller Agents are remaining arrogant and partial to certain farmers and are not farmers friendly. Participating in the discussion, the Farmers Representatives also expressed that in reality the Miller Agent is the most important person in the PPC who decide which paddy to be procured or not. After a thorough discussion, the Miller Representatives agreed that such Agent will be appointed with precaution and any complain against them will be entertained seriously by replacing him immediately. In this context, the Collector, Kalahandi stated that the Millers Agent will be authorised by the Sub-Collectors on recommendation of the OSCSC Ltd.. Kalahandi and also issue Identity Card of the Miller Agent.

The CSO, again reiterated that the millers or their Agent shall remain present at the time of quality analysis and weighment of paddy, so that in future the Miller will not raise question about the quality as well as weighment of paddy after issue of Vendor Receipt to Farmer.

The Sub-Collector, Dharamgarh stated that due to non-arrival of Millers' vehicle in the PPC, the procurement process has been delayed a lot, and so the Millers should engage adequate vehicles to lift such paddy on the same day and before commencement of procurement must submit the Vehicle Movement Plan (PPC-wise & Vehicle-wise) to the Authority with the Vehicle Registration Numbers.

10. ROLE OF RMC :

The Sub-Collector, Dharamgarh stated that as per the Food Policy, the RMC will supply required infrastructure and equipment to the PACS/ PPCs well in advance before commencement of paddy procurement operation.

The CSO, Kalahandi stated that the RMC will perform the IEC activities (Publicity campaign) such as Loud Speaker announcement, distribution of Leaflets well in advance prior to commencement of paddy procurement. The publication of procurement programme is to be made in any one leading widely circulated local Odia Newspaper by each RMC.

RMC Authority should engage at least two competent staffs along with required latest equipments for proper and error-free quality analysis of paddy with the help of the purchase team of PPC. The RMC Authority is solely responsible for proper analysis of paddy at PACS

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level and maintain farmer wise relevant records for future reference. The ARCS, Dharamgarh stated that to cover up more and more farmers, at least 4 set of equipments for such analysis need to be supplied to all PPCs for quick quality analysis in the PPC.

The CSO, Kalahandi insisted that at least one Specialist Analyst Team be kept ready in each RMC Level to redress quality aspects in case of any disputes.

11. ROLE OF REVENUE INSPECTOR (RI) AND VILLAGE AGRICULTURE WORKER (VAW):

The CSO, Kalahandi stated that like previous year, the RIs will be tagged to each PPC who will issue Advance Token to the Farmers. In no case, the Purchase Officer can issue Advance Token without the consent of the RIs. Any deviation to this provision will be dealt with stringent action.

The CSO, Kalahandi also stated that the VAWs will be tagged to each PPCs who will remain as the Authorised Officer of the PPC. They will monitor all activities of the PPC by remaining present in the PPC in all purchase days and in case of necessity, they can authenticate any procurement related documents in the PPC. The DDA, Kalahandi was requested to supply the names of G.P. wise VAWs and their contact numbers for said tagging.

12. ROLE OF BLOCK NODAL OFFICER:

The CSO, Kalahandi stated that like previous year, the Tahasildars will be the Nodal Officer of each Block who will control the paddy procurement. He will resolve all disputes arise in the PPC and all procurement related officials in the PACS/ PPC under the Block shall work under his direction.

13. FUNCTIONING OF CONTROL ROOM:

As per the provision of the Food Policy one control room will be made functional in the district office during the period of Paddy Procurement to record any message and grievance of the farmers. Similarly one control room will function in both the Sub-divisions for quick redressal of the grievance of the farmers.

14. MONITORING, SUPERVISION AND ENFORCEMENT:

In order to ensure , close monitoring of the procurement operation in the district as per the provision of the Food Policy District Level Nodal Officer , Sub-division Level Nodal Officer and Block Level Nodal Officer shall be appointed.

It was resolved that 3 Nos. of vehicles shall be engaged for the period of procurement for the purpose.

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15. OTHER DISCUSSIONS MADE:

i) Regarding verification of Bank Accounts of farmers, the CSO stated that the Banks are not submitting the accounts verification data for which Farmers Registration could not be updated, as a result of which their marketable surplus is not be exhibited in P-PAS portal. Specially the State Bank of India is not responding. In reply, the Lead Bank Manager stated that he has forwarded the data to respective Branches of SBI for verification of the Accounts and assured the house that he will personally monitor the bank account verification of farmers by all Banks.

The Hon'ble MLA, Junagarh stated that during the procurement, the farmers are facing much difficulty due to shortage of cash in the disbursing bank branches of the district. In this context, the LBM explained that the liquid cash movement is made through the RBI, and so such liquid flow depends on the supply of currency notes by the RBI. The Hon'ble MLA instructed the LDM to make aware the RBI much before the procurement so that in no case there is any kind of shortage of liquid cash in the district.

ii) Then the CSO stated that quality analysis of paddy of each farmer must be conducted in presence of the farmer, Purchase Officer & his team of the PPC and the Miller Agent and the findings should be recorded. Very often complaints are being received on cutting of weight of paddy in the PPCs on quality ground for which the procurement operation is being blamed and a bad message is going to public.

As per the principle, the paddy that to be purchased, should confirm the standard specification norms of FAQ paddy prescribed by the Government of India. In case of non FAQ paddy, either the farmer will return the paddy and after improving the quality bring to PPC for sale. The Farmers are also allowed to clean the paddy in the market yard at their own cost instead of taking back to his home. So RMC has to engage trained quality analysts to collect samples, conduct free and fair quality analysis of the paddy of each farmer to ensure purchase of FAQ paddy and payment of MSP Rs.1750.00 per Quintal.

iii) The Farmers Representatives raised that there is involvement of middlemen in the PPCs who create obstacle in quality analysis in a fair manner, rather they encourage fixed cutting in the PPC. They also stated that some Miller-Agents themselves are middlemen/trader, and so the Millers should not engage such persons as their Agents in the PPCs. In this context, the Collector, Kalahandi directed that the Sub-Collectors will issue Authorisation and ID Cards to the Miller-Agents.

iv) The Sub-collector, Dharmagarh insisted upon lifting of entire paddy on the same day, i.e. date of arrival of paddy in the PPC. In no case the farmers having Advance Token for the next PPC day will face any kind of inconvenience. Further, the Custom Millers should engage required number of trucks and submit a list of vehicles as per the target assigned to lift the paddy and also make labour arrangement at the Mill point for unloading of the paddy so that the vehicles can be used more frequently for lifting of paddy.

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v) The Millers Representatives stated that movement of paddy loaded trucks is restricted at Bhawanipatna due to No-entry imposed by Traffic Police, so timely lifting of paddy from the PPC is affected. They requested for relaxation of No-entry for the paddy loaded trucks. The Collector, Kalahandi assured to look into the matter.

vi) The Millers Representative also requested to consider their representation regarding gunny depreciation towards supply of once used gunny bags for bagging of paddy at the PPC. The CSO, in this context, expressed that this is a State level policy decision, so the representation will be sent to the Corporation Head Office and Government for taking necessary action.

vii) Further CSO stated that Mandi handling charges are released for de-bagging of farmers' paddy, re-bagging and loading on to the trucks of the miller after weighment. The PACS doing this exercise will be given Mandi handling charges. The CCTV should be fixed to preserve the recorded proof of Mandi handling activities.

In the course of discussion, the ARCS, Dharmagarh stated that the Mandi Labour part may be done by the Miller or Labour Contractor, so that the problem faced by the PACS for engaging labour could be avoided. Further, he put forth in the meeting that there is an outstanding of Rs.32.10 Crores receivable for Procurement of Paddy from the OSCSC Ltd. towards the Mandi Handling and other claims. In reply, the CSO said that he has intimated the DRCS, Kalahandi to submit the year wise detail statement of exact amount pending for payment to examine and he assured to make necessary arrangements for release of the same. The Collector, Kalahandi instructed the DRCS, Kalahandi to prepare and submit the detail report and stated that the PACS will undertake Mandi Handling Operation for procurement of Khariff paddy during the KMS:2018-19.

viii) The ARCS, Dharamgarh informed the house that there are only 62 numbers of Grade- I & II staff working in the PACS in Dharamgarh Circle and 98 numbers of PPCs have been selected for the procurement and with such staff strength it will be difficult to manage all 98 PPCs or to engage Purchase Officers in all PPCs. He therefore wanted to engage staff of other Department as Purchase Officers in some PPCs. In this matter the Collector, Kalahandi articulated that PACS need to engage its Purchase Officers in the PPCs, however he assured to discuss in the matter later and the problem will be sorted out.

ix) On delivery of CMR by the millers to FCI, the CSO stated that about 70% of resultant CMR is delivered to the FCI which is nearly 24 lakhs quintals. But the FCI has not adequate godown capacity to accommodate the CMR when the millers want to deliver particularly in peak period within the time line fixed by the Govt. In this context, the FCI representative expressed that they have only storage capacity of 6 lakhs of quintal of rice. Hon'ble MLA, Collector and other members asked the FCI to make adequate godown space available by hiring the extra godowns and also speed up evacuation process. The matter should be discussed with the Area Manager FCI and GM, FCI. Area Manager, FCI should meet the Collector to discuss the plan and strategy of godown capacity and evacuation process.

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x) Deliberation of Hon'ble MLA, Junagarh : Hon'ble MLA in his speech expressed that in order to avoid unfair practices of middlemen and involvement of agents in such affair activities, the millers should give I-Card to each Agent with a copy to the Sub-Collector and CSO. The millers should submit a vehicle plan with RC book of each Truck to the Sub-Collector to monitor the paddy lifting process.

While discussing the verification of Bank Accounts of farmers and availability of liquid cash in the bank Hon'ble MLA expressed displeasure on the behavior/ attitude shown towards the customers/ farmers by the branch banks of State Bank of India. The SBI officers have no little sympathy towards the poor farmers, even they do not respond to the Public Representatives. He also reiterated that farmers are facing problem mostly due to cash crunch in the district during the procurement due to lack of proper liquid cash flow plan by the RBI/ Banks. So he requested the Collector, Kalahandi to empathize the matter to the higher quarter to maintain liquid cash reserve to meet the demand of the farmers at least during the process of procurement.

Hon'ble MLA, Junagarh was of the opinion that most of the women are working hard in the field for paddy cultivation. They should be rewarded in the Kalahandi Festival as ideal farmer. One woman farmer should be included in the DLPC as Farmers Representative. Farmers should have institutional support from every corner and officers.

All the participants supported the suggestion made by the Hon'ble MLA that the local police should be entrusted the duty of law and order in each PACS/PPC to prevent the activities of miscreants, disrupting elements and middlemen in paddy procurement.

xi) Deliberation of the Collector, Kalahandi: While addressing the meeting, the Collector, Kalahandi assured to take necessary steps to resolve the issues like maintaining liquid cash reserve in State Bank of India, FCI to hire more godowns to accommodate the CMR whenever the millers want to deliver and timely evacuation to outside states and movement of paddy loaded trucks through Bhawanipatna town.

He also instructed to keep all infrastructures, manpower and instruments ready before commencement of paddy procurement. Quality analysis training should be given to the RMC personnel, Purchase Officers, VAWs, Society level committee members and farmers as well. IEC activities should be firmly taken up to create awareness among the farmers about FAQ norms and MSP of paddy, so that the farmers will bring FAQ paddy to the Society and get MSP.

Lifting of paddy from the Society should be ensured on the same day of purchase. The millers should submit the list of vehicles and engage the vehicles in time to lift the paddy in order to avoid any deviation in purchase as per the programme. No small thing shall be highlighted.

There should be team work and combined effort to make the procurement operation smooth and successful.

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xii) Considering the proposal of the CSO, it was decided that the PACS to purchase a maximum of Q.50.00 from each farmer per day so that small and marginal farmers will get chance first to bring paddy and purchase a total of Q.1000.00 per day per PPC and on 01.11.2018 the commencement of paddy procurement will be held.

The CSO, Kalahandi at the end of the meeting proposed the vote of thanks to the Chair, to Hon'ble MLA and to all the participants.
